Dear Friends,

This year Ash Wednesday fell on February 14<sup>th</sup>, Valentine's Day. Easter Sunday is on April 1<sup>st</sup>, April Fool's Day. I love the juxtaposition of these two dates. Many people, both in Jesus' day and in our own, would call the Crucifixion the ultimate act of a fool. Yet, as Paul says in his first letter to the Corinthians, "Jews demand signs and Greeks desire wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength."

God's gift of eternal life is offered to us through the "foolish" love of Jesus Christ's crucifixion. Our response to this Divine proclamation of love is, quite simply, our daily choice to love as we have been loved. Lent offers us an opportunity and challenge to go deeper in our response to God's love. Our baptism empowers us to "walk in newness of life". May this Lent remind us that we are invited to become "fools" for love – to look beyond surface appearances, to seek beyond easy answers, and to join God's continuing declaration of Love to the world.

The Parish then elected two new members to the Vestry, Jim Pender and Becky Everett and reelected or treasurer, Marry Murray to serve another term on the Vestry. Thanks were also expressed to Charlene Currutt for her service as the Parish representative to the Northeast Mission Area Council, NEMAC, and Linda Webb was elected to follow in her place for a one-year term of service on this important consortium of Parish mission representatives.

Our new Vestry member, Jim Pender and Becky Everett are both lifelong devoted Parishioners and I am certain that with their energy and expertise, they will be wonderful additions to the Vestry.

On February 28, 2018 the Vestry will hold a half-day long retreat session which will begin with the regular monthly Vestry meeting focusing upon orientation of new Vestry members and strategic planning for the year. In addition to the regular business of the Vestry, the retreat will also contain a session on stewardship and a session focusing upon the vision for the Parish both in the coming year and in the longer future.

On February 11, following the 10:15 AM service, the annual Shrove Tuesday (on Sunday) pancake breakfast was held. This year featured a new menu and an improved culinary technique producing an even better pancake breakfast. This was enjoyed by all especially the youngsters. Charley Marston, Junior Warden, thanked all for the renovations of the church which are being undertaken. Charley thanked the many parishioners for their efforts and contributions to the church. We will be undertaking many more projects in 2018.

Mary Murray, Treasurer, noted that the church broke even in 2017, and expressed gratitude to all for their contributions.

Dr. Irwin moved to conclude the meeting. Mary Murray seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:24 AM.

### PARISH REPORT

It doesn't take much observation to know that the world is a broken place. Violence, racial hatred, sickness and death, they are all daily reminders of this world's brokenness. It is enough to make you feel pretty hopeless.

As Christians, we believe that this brokenness has one origin: our brokenness from God., otherwise known as sin. Sin is the gap that stands between us and the Creator. Because we are broken from God, we are also broken from one another, hopelessly disconnected from the source of our being and from our brothers and sisters. And in our hearts I believe we hunger to be put back together, to be reconciled with God and with one another.

It is to bridge that gap, to feed that hunger, to fill that hole, that Jesus Christ came; not with power, not with great psychological methods, not with grand philosophy or "just the right words" but with love.

Our Stephen Ministers have been ministering to their care receivers in the parish. They know brokenness firsthand. But they are also people who have tasted the wholeness that comes from faith in Jesus.

Our task as Stephen Ministers is not to cure hurting people of their ills or solve their problems. It is not even to make them feel better. Our task is to BE: to be loving, to give life giving presence of our own faith in their midst. By listening, caring, loving, being compassionate and present, we accompany hurting broken people on the long journey toward wholeness.

When we establish trusting, compassionate and confidential relationships with hurting people in the name of Jesus Christ, healing begins. How healing it is to be listened to when we know that we are really being heard and understood. How satisfying it is to be loved and not judged. To be free to be who we really are. This is how broken lives can become strong. This is the gift that Stephen Ministers offer in the name of Jesus Christ.

I feel so blessed to be part of this amazing ministry.

The relationship between a caregiver and care receiver can be a very special, meaningful one. The following excerpts were taken from a letter one of our care receivers recently wrote to a caregiver.

When you visit me here, I enjoy looking at your eager, fresh face. Your eyes connect with me and it is great to see your full smile.

Then, of course, there are the discussions and conversations that we have. I truly feel that I can tell you anything – that no topic is "out of bounds." I have been reading and re-reading Book #1 on Loss and Grieving. As a replacement for you, I have re-read the book, highlighting and encircling what is important and new for me.

Especially poignant is a section that talks about grieving and one's relationship to God. I identify with the thoughts that grieving may make one feel more separate from God. This is how I feel. I remember in the past I felt close to God, loving – even "touched by God." Now I am so angry at God. I feel God took away everything and everyone I liked (except you) and left me "bare bones" abandoned.

My church friends visiting are the only touches of peace and hope. Each day I read the books that I obtained from you. They "pump" me up and keep me going.
