RECTOR'S REPORT

2022 started off with the Omicron surge sending us back to Zoom meetings and online worship from January 9th through February 13th. It was a relief and joy to resume gathering in person again on Sunday February 20th. Although John Irwin continues to record Sunday worship, we were able to worship, work, and play together in person for the rest of 2022. It was a particular joy to be able to observe Palm Sunday, Holy Week, and Easter with each other. A new event in 2022 was the Pentecost parish picnic at Marston Park. Pickle Ball, Bocce, fried chicken with all the fixings and lots of laughter ensued. All the special services and events that shape our parish's yearly cycle were well attended. I was particularly pleased to have 70 children and their parents attend the Christmas Eve Family Vespers considering the severe cold which had led to the cancellation of the Village's traditional bon fire and visit from Santa. As we begin 2023, I am hopeful, perhaps even confident, that this year we will not have to suspend in person worship. The years since March of 2020 have been challenging and St. Christopher's has risen to Covid's challenge each time with determination creativity, patience, and (mostly) good humor.

Following a fire that destroyed Lucy's brother's home in Peru, you all stepped up and generously provided enough funds for a new brick house to be built. Oscar, Elena, and newborn baby Lucy will never have to be made homeless again. The love that you showed through those gifts left Oscar in tears that people who had never met him would care so much. Through you, he felt God's love.

In March we became a "host site" for Rainbow Farm's CSA (community supported agriculture) program. Larry and Tina, Rainbow Farm's owners, offer seasonal subscriptions for weekly deliveries of fresh produce to St. Christopher's. The produce is delivered to our bridge-side back hall on Wednesday mornings for pick up by subscribers. Rainbow Farm's CSA has been well received by both parishioners and our Gates Mills neighbors.

Deacon Lydia Bailey once again offered a Lenten Art Retreat at the Cleveland Museum of Art. Our relationship with the residents of the Men's Shelter deepened this year as we returned to in person service. So many of you baked casseroles and cookies, donated supplies for "Welcome Home" boxes, and shared enough quotations for a fundraising 2024 Day by Day calendar! Weekly discussions of "We Make the Road By Walking" continued throughout 2022 on Thursday afternoons and Sundays between the two worship services. Bi-weekly meetings of the Grief Support Group and the Stephen Ministry continued to be led by Kathy Pender and have offered comfort and companionship to many individuals both within and beyond our parish. Bargain Box returned with the first sale since the fall of 2019, and it was a huge success! So many of you participated in service projects and various outreach opportunities that I fear leaving someone out! Please be sure to read each group's report. St. Christopher's is small but mighty when it comes to following Jesus in the Way of Love!

Although we rejoiced to be together for worship, service, and fellowship many of our older, or health compromised members have not been able to rejoin us. As a result, more of my time in 2022 has been devoted to home visits and providing Communion to our members who can no longer be with us on Sunday mornings. I have developed a schedule which allows me to provide a visit and share Communion twice a month in most cases, once a month or every other month in a few instances. I treasure these visits and I am grateful to do this on your behalf.

In 2022 I buried Warner Batton, Robert Weitzel, Shannon Reynolds, Beverly Ann Sarkisian Lambert, Beverly Berlin, James Gough, David C. Dressler, and Jean W. Mosely. Not all of them were parishioners but all of them are children of God and this, too, is part of my service as a parish priest. The year ended sadly with two deaths;

Ron Miscko died on Christmas Day and Lou Boswell's daughter, Amy, died the following week. They have left huge holes in the hearts of all those who knew and loved them. Our heartfelt prayers for Carolyn and her family and for Lou continue.

Weddings and Baptisms provided moments of great joy over the course of the year. I officiated at the weddings of Kyle Mlakar & Alexandra Knerly, Joseph Scaminace & Cindy Maglosky, and Charley Lafave & Victoria Mills. We celebrated five baptisms this year: Vivienne Radis, Lucy Radis, Tabitha Luby, Patrick Scott Hoeflinger, Jr., and Douglas M. Horner, III (who was baptized by Bishop Hollingsworth during his Visitation to St. Christopher's on November 20th).

Every parish priest is expected to contribute to the life and ministry of the Diocese as well as to their parish. Since 2016, I have served as a Fresh Start mentor; a program led by Percy Grant that offers clergy who are newly ordained (or new to the Diocese) orientation to the practice of parish ministry, continuing education, and guidance through the inevitable hiccups of the parish priest "learning curve". I continue to serve as a Spiritual Director for several of my clergy colleagues and, when requested, to seminarians preparing for ordination. I have served as the Diocesan Chaplain to The Daughters of The King since 2015.

Much of what you have just read would not be possible but for our wonderful parish staff. I deeply value each of them for the gifts that they bring to their work and the genuine love that they feel for this parish. That love shows in their dedication and faithful fulfillment of their responsibilities. "Thank you" doesn't express my gratitude for each of them nearly enough. Nonetheless, thank you Deacon Lydia, Yuri, Mary, Becky, Peggy, Melanie, Lucy, Luis, and Jolyon. Without each of you (and all of you as a team) St. Christopher's would not be able to carry out the work to which God has called us; to love our neighbor and change the world.

An important moment in the life of our parish this past year was, of course, the election of Ann Jolly to be our next Diocesan Bishop. The parish delegation to the Electing Convention consisted of Judy Holmes, Mary Holmes, John Irwin, Deacon Lydia, and me. We were a good team, and it was exciting to be part of calling Bishop Hollingsworth's successor.

Finally, I want to express my continuing gratitude for members of your Vestry; those who will continue to serve in 2023 and those who are retiring from their Vestry service. Mary Holmes has completed two, three-year, terms as a member of the Vestry and served as Clerk in 2022. Charley Marston insists that this time he is retiring "for real" – we'll see! Charley has helmed this parish through all the changes that life sends our way, serving most recently as our Junior Warden. Thank you both for your devotion to St. Christopher's. While not a member of the Vestry, Mary Murray has served as our parish Treasurer for going on eight years. Amazingly, she is willing to continue to serve as our Treasurer. Thank you, Mary!! Continuing Vestry members are Ron Lee, who served as Senior Warden in 2022, Becky Everett, Renee Kolecki, Bruce Long, and Peter Thatcher. Charlene Currutt filled a spot on the Vestry when Sandy Redmond moved to Vermont. Charlene has been nominated to complete Sandy Redmond's first three-year term. Judy Holmes has completed her first three-year term on the Vestry and has been nominated to serve a second three-year term. I am grateful to you all for your wisdom and devotion to our parish. Barb Pesuit and Matt Vazzanna have been nominated to serve on the Vestry for the first time. I look forward to partnering with the Wardens and Vestry in this coming year as we continue to grow as a parish seeking to follow the teachings of Jesus.

May 2023 be a year of joyful service as we respond to God's call to love as we have been loved.

Minutes of the 2021 Annual Meeting of The Parish of St. Christopher by-the-River

The Annual Meeting of St. Christopher's by-the-River was called to order by Mother Ann at 10:13am.

Mother Ann led the meeting with a prayer.

Mother Ann confirmed a quorum of **32** electors in attendance as well as **3** clergy. She then noted that Tom Matthews was in attendance and as Clerk would take the meeting minutes.

The year has brought some new families into our parish fold and we rejoice in the faces of the little ones. Occasionally, we have welcomed a few children into the Nursery, but irregular attendance has not yet merited resuming Church School classes. Hoping to encourage a more regular presence of families with children, we are trying a different approach.

In our planning meeting in July 2022, our idea was to reacquaint/introduce members of our congregation to the church calendar, to the seasons of the year and, of course, how the church seasons tell the story of life of Jesus Christ. Unfortunately, Covid left many of us in a state of isolation, detachment and out of the rhythm of church community. It is the face to face interaction that is most effective in sharing and developing faith, not only for the children, but also for adults.

Each month we try to offer some form of communication or an event that is open to the whole parish, but focused on families with children. Each is meant to bring us together, share a tradition of our Christian heritage and have fun in community. From Valentine to Easter cards to every child in our parish in 2022 we tried to reach out and let the children know that we have not forgotten them.

Starting with Rally Sunday in September (the beginning of our Church Year), we offered a schedule of events, registration forms, prizes and activities for the children. Craft stations were set up to create and decorate the Christmas star, wreath, candy canes and gifts. The workshop was well attended by several families who stayed well into the afternoon. There was an authentic joy in the air at these events! Let’s get together more often! Let’s live our Christian traditions together! SENIOR WARDEN'S REPORT

2022 began at St. Christophers with great hopes that we could burst out of Covid health constraints robustly with the return to our traditional indoor services. While Covid concerns kept reappearing over the course of the year, we did return to our regular in-person church schedule. It has been great to hear our enthusiastic little choir performing once again under Yuri Elliott's direction. John Irwin has continued his contribution of recording our services and making them available online immediately thereafter for those unable to attend in person. John deserves special accolades for becoming licensed to deliver sermons. His homilies when Mother Ann was on vacation in October were well conceived and thoughtful.

While we hoped to have more events wherein there would be opportunities to gather and socialize, periodic Covid surges have often curtailed these plans. However, we did have a few traditional social events that were well attended and enthusiastically embraced—those being a Pentecost picnic at Marston Park and a September Rally Day picnic on church grounds.

Our vestry consists of a compatible and dedicated group, eager to be responsive to the mission of St. Christopher's. We have three vestry members whose 3-year terms have completed. Mary Holmes has played a key role in serving as the vestry clerk and also heading the stewardship committee. Mary and Tom have moved to Cleveland Heights but Mary has remained on the vestry to complete her term. Charley Marston is also completing his 3-year term on vestry as well as his latest tour of duty as Jr. Warden. Charley's contributions in both roles will be greatly missed. His attention to the maintenance of our lovely historical site and facility has been a challenging undertaking. He has met that challenge completely, not only in coordinating maintenance and improvement projects, but also in securing special funding for many of the major challenges. Thankfully Charley has no plans to move (I hope). Judy Holmes has completed her three-year term as well and has graciously agreed to serve an additional term. It will be great having Judy's attentive focus as a vestry person continue. Grateful thanks should be extended to Mary, Judy, and Charley.

We also miss Sandy Redmond whose 3-year term was interrupted at mid-point when an opportunity came to implement her long term desire to retire to Vermont near her sister. We are fortunate, however, that Charlene Currutt has agreed to complete Sandy's term which extends through 2023.

Special appreciation is due to Lucy Lytle for her outstanding performance leading the stewardship drive for 2023. Lucy's enthusiastic efforts inspired us to step up broadly to increase our pledges for 2023. Consequently we have been able to extend modest pay increases to the St. Christopher's staff. It is great that our congregation sustained its contributions as consistently as it has over the months of the pandemic. We are a fortunate community. It is gratifying to experience its compassion and its strong commitment, both within the parish and to its outreach programs.

It has been our good fortune to have Mother Ann's leadership and guidance in these unusual times that might have been disastrous over the past two years. Her steadying influence and nurturing counsel have kept St. Christophers on an even keel.

JUNIOR WARDEN'S REPORT

Everyone reading this report should be well aware of the many many things Becky Everett does for our church community and beyond. This has included serving five years (and still counting) on the vestry and three of them as Junior Warden. When she asked last spring to step down in that capacity, I switched from Senior Warden to Junior Warden for my final year.

Little did I know about the surprises our 170-year-old building and grounds were in need of fixing or replacing. Becky had dealt with the ceiling collapse in the kitchen, replacing the boiler for heating the church, and installing a generator at the rectory. The following is a list of the 2022 major projects which were paid from our Capital Campaign Fund, which you all helped create.

- Fire Alarm System \$2,430.00
- Kitchen Ceiling \$15,377.92
- Church Boiler \$11,650.00
- Rectory Generator \$9,360.30
- Repair broken Sewer Pipe \$7,750.00
- Replace Rectory Boiler \$4,828.00
- Repair Front Steps \$965.00

Additionally, we had wanted to complete other projects, but the contractors we have hired had a big back log ahead of us. They promise to be here in the spring when the weather permits. These projects include:

- Paint portions of the front and two sides of the church \$17,700.00
- Replace broken sidewalk stones and the steps up to the door on the rectory side of the church \$9,000.00

Every year we also budget \$10,000.00 for miscellaneous maintenance projects which Luis and Lucy utilize as they do great work throughout the church and grounds. Our treasurer's report shows \$9,680.95 was spent.

In my 2018 Junior Warden's Report, I wrote about the tremendous financial support we have received from the Figgie Family and The Figgie Foundation. Faced with 2022 and 2023 capital expenses of over \$90,000.00, I reached out to the head of the Figgie Foundation, Rick Solon. After he came and looked at our projects, he then asked his fellow trustees for a \$60,000.00 gift on our behalf, and it was granted.

Throughout the years, The Veale Foundation has been a very important supporter. Included in last December's gift was an allocation of \$5,000.00 to be applied to help cover the aforementioned expenses.

Thanks to these two gifts, we go into 2023 in good shape financially to keep God's beautiful home here in Gates Mills in good condition.

2022 STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT

The *2023 Annual Giving Campaign Team* (Lucy Lytle, Debbie Cole, Rindy Collister, Laura Cotton, Becky Everett, Leslie Marting, Barb Pesuit, Kitty Thomas, Jan Tuttle, and Kathy Vilas) is grateful for the extraordinary generosity of the people of St. Christopher's. To date, the church has received 79 pledges for 2023 totaling \$185,485. That is more than \$20,000 above our goal! Nearly 70% of pledging households increased their pledges from the previous year.

Everyone in the parish will be invited to sit on the lawn and enjoy cookies and lemonade as we listen to a 30-minute concert by Becky Everett. Since many villagers attended previous concerts during the height of the pandemic, we will extend an invitation to everyone in Gates Mills and neighboring communities to join us in the hope of recruiting some new parishioners in the process! In accordance with the spending policy for the year 2022, the Fund *distributed a total of \$139,240.40* to St. Christopher by-the-River's operating funds. Distributions are made on a quarterly basis.

Total gifts to the fund in 2022 were \$5,000. We wish to recognize and thank our donors for their generous support. Their kindness will have a major impact on the financial security of St. Christopher by-the-River.

TREASURER'S REPORT

St. Christophers recognized strong financial performance in 2022 based on the generosity of our parishioners, two of whom made special gifts for the year. As a result, Pledge and Plate receipts were up by over \$20 thousand from 2021. This brought total receipts to \$420 thousand which was slightly over budget. Although it appears that total receipts were less than 2021's receipts, please recall that 2021 includes \$42.8 thousand related to the forgiveness of our PPP loan. Net of that item, receipts increased by a healthy 9.8%. Lastly, the St. Christopher's Fund continues to support the Parish at a consistent level based on 5.25% of its trailing 12 quarter assets. Operating expenses were up very modestly from the previous year.

With 2022's positive performance, the Vestry has approved pay adjustments for our staff for 2023. While we are likely to show a small deficit for the current year, St. Christophers has not adjusted salaries over the last 5 years. Staff retention is an important goal. Other operating expenses have remained tightly controlled to the extent they can be although we do expect increases in utilities costs.

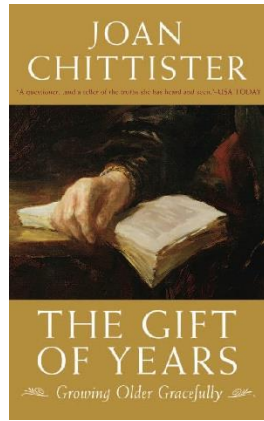
