Dear Friends,

In The Gospel According to John Chapter 10 Verses 7-10, Jesus says, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly."

An abundant life is not without pain, sorrows, or challenges. But it does imply a deep joy in our souls that is able to sustain and carry us through all the changes and chances of this life. The source of that "abundant life" is, of course God's presence with us always in the person of the Holy Spirit within us. There are many spiritual practices that can strengthen our ability to experience that abundant life regardless of the challenges that come our way; unforeseen and often unwelcomed. This summer, if you would like to explore some spiritual practices that have sustained two joyful spiritual giants of our time, I hope you will join the "Talking Faith" group that meets on Thursday afternoons and Sunday mornings.

This summer in "Talking Faith", we will be reading and discussing The Book of JOY. We will also have the opportunity to try several "joy practices" used by His Holiness the Dalai Lama and Archbishop Desmond Tutu. I hope that this description from the book's front flap will entice you to join us on Thursdays at 4:00 or Sundays at 9:00 in the Guild Room. We can <u>all</u> do with experiencing more joy and resilience in our day-to-day lives!

Nobel Peace Prize Laureates His Holiness the Dalai Lama and Archbishop Desmond Tutu have survived more than fifty years of exile and the soul-crushing violence of oppression. Despite their hardships – or, as they would say, because of them – they are two of the most joyful people on the planet.

In April 2015, Archbishop Tutu traveled to the Dalai Lama's home in Dharamsala, India, to celebrate His Holiness's eightieth birthday and to create what they hoped would be a gift for others. They looked back on their long lives to answer a single burning question: How do we find joy in the face of life's inevitable suffering?

They traded intimate stories, teased each other continually, and shared their spiritual practices. By the end of a week filled with laughter and punctuated with tears, these two global heroes had stared into the abyss and despair of our times and revealed how to live a life brimming with joy.

...We get to listen in as they explore the Nature of True Joy and confront each of the Obstacles to Joy – from fear, stress, and anger to grief, illness, and death. They then offer us the Eight Pillars of Joy, which provide the foundation for lasting happiness. Throughout, they include stories, wisdom, and science. Finally, they share the daily Joy Practices that anchor their own emotional and spiritual lives.

The Archbishop has never claimed sainthood, and the Dalai Lama considers himself a simple monk. In this unique collaboration, they offer us the reflection of real lives filled with pain and turmoil in the midst of which they have been able to discover a level of peace, of courage, and of joy to which we can all aspire in our own lives.

Dear St. Christopher's,

When I walked into the shelter this morning, one of my first interactions was with a shelter resident who is deaf. He uses his phone to type out his messages. You see, shelter staff and case workers have traditionally distributed bus passes to those who need them for essential appointments. But recently the funding has decreased for bus passes.

All proceeds of the calendar generously go toward purchasing bus passes for this shelter. On behalf of the resident I mentioned who is deaf, and all the other shelter residents and staff here at Lutheran Metropolitan Ministry Men's Shelter, thank you for this project!

I already received my Day by Day calendar and have been moved by the love, variety of insight, and -I must say- wonderful I sense of humor sprinkled throughout. This is a calendar that is staying close to me, not just for 2024! 


