Dear Friends,

As the weather has shifted lately from full summer to intimations of autumn, I have found myself thinking about the variety of times and seasons in our lives. As Alice and I returned from our walk this morning, this phrase from a Joni Mitchell song ran through my head: "and the seasons, they go round and round" – so very true. And as the lyrics make so clear, there is no going backward in time. We often think of time as linear, but it is cyclical. For the most part, it follows a spiraling path through our lives and so we often have the sense of coming around to an old familiar place where we have been before.

We are about to begin "the program year" on September 10th – Rally Sunday. It begins a new season of our life in the parish by regathering (rallying) to reconnect with each other after scattering to a variety of places and activities over the summer months. Yet this is also the moment in the "Church Year" when our lectionary readings each Sunday move us toward the looming end of one liturgical cycle and toward the beginning of a new Church Year on Advent I. There is also, of course, another time cycle – Stewardship – our Annual Giving campaign in support of our 2024 operating budget. That's just in the context of our parish life.

Our personal lives are no different. This Church Year has been particularly full of important moments in our individual lives. The deaths, marriages, and baptisms that many of you have experienced since Advent I in 2022 all marked moments of permanent change in your lives. Moments when our individual journeys through the spiral of time came into focus in an intensely personal way.

We recently finished reading and discussing "The Book of Joy" – a conversation between the Dalai Lama and Archbishop Desmond Tutu. A point that they repeatedly returned to, was the importance of cultivating a practice of gratitude in our daily lives. This is so very true! To experience a feeling of gratitude, we need to become conscious of the blessings within each day. That practice of being conscious – of noticing and appreciating – places us firmly in the present moment. The past is composed of memories and the future lives only in our imagination. This present moment is the only reality that exists.

As our parish and personal seasons continue to shift, I invite you to take a moment or two each day to name what has been good and to say "thank you" to God who is the true giver of the blessings in our lives. It is gratitude (not hoeing out our closets) that sparks true joy in our lives. I wish true joy for all of you. You spark joy in me – every day!

Rector's Report:

Reviewed parts one, two & three of the 2022 audit report prepared by Mary Murray with assistance of parishioner Brian Wright.

Looking into possibilities to conduct an external audit.

Becky moved to accept the audit that Mary Murray submitted and recommendations she suggested. Charlene seconded. The Vestry unanimously approved the 2022 Audit report with recommendations.

May budget income is up \$20,000 from last year. Everything looks good.

Twenty-six pay period system; two times per year there are three pay periods.

Insurance line under operating expenses reflects bookkeeping issue, not money issue.

Updates regarding Christian Education Director: google docs description will be posted on

Diocesan website weekly "What's New in Diocese" and area college sites that offer degrees in Early Childhood Education.

Vestry input:

Salary range, part time, 10-15 hours per week, less time in summer, but for special preparation for upcoming school year, \$10-12K annually. Hired on an hourly-rate basis.

Becky moved that we propose a salary range of hiring of new Christian Education Director

Peter seconded. There was no discussion and the motion passed.

We need to identify two people to fill position for Vestry; can consider options and vote in July meeting.

Mother Ann asked Vestry members to email her with suggestions but asked that members do not ask anyone specifically.

The Vestry appointment will extend until the next annual meeting.

Senior Warden's Report:

Attended Clericus meeting a month ago. Rector at St. Andrews stated they have no need for their Godly Play materials that provides education through middle school-age and offered the materials for free. An anonymous donor offered \$3k for purchase of materials and we may have \$1500 available. Would like to offer St. Andrews the money for materials and bookshelves, which is less than we would have had to pay if buying it outright. No annual cost.

Charlene proposed we use \$4500 for Godly Play (see amounts above;) Ron seconded.

No discussion. All approved.

Junior Warden's Report:

Charlene thanked those who attended the defibrillator review and stated we will have another session in Fall, 2023 for those who couldn't make it. Will order trauma scissors as recommended by instructor.

Dennis Farmer completed work on walkways. Will fill spaces between stones with poly-sand to keep stones in place and reduce weeds. Per Becky, projects are a safety necessity.

Peter moved to authorize payment for gator dust/poly-sand. Becky seconded and all approved.

Char received a call from Charley Marston. Charley wants to decorate the front of church for July 4th.

Next Gen Committee Report:

Event July 21st at 5pm for young families and couples involved in church. "Let's Meet" social event in Guild Room and nursery will be open. Heavy hors d'oeuvres and child-friendly food will be served. Idea started at the Pentecost picnic. If any Vestry members (Next Gen) are interested in attending, let Becky know. Per Mother Ann, there is money available for food.

Fun Committee Report:

Seeking details for the Lake County Captains baseball game.

August 13th is third summer Faith Night.

Mary Zup will post survey in Flocknote when she returns from vacation asking for those interested respond with anticipated number of tickets. Mary will be on vacation next week and returns July 11th.

Will be announced at 10:15 service.

Forty-five people attended the Pentecost picnic. People stayed longer than last year. \$200 in expenses. \$39 donation.

Next Vestry meeting is July 26th at 6:30 p.m.

The meeting closed with a prayer at 7:18 p.m.


