Dear Friends,

By now you may have heard that I spent last weekend in Hillcrest Hospital. I am home now, and all is well, but I have decided to share my story with you, both to relieve any anxiety that you may be feeling and also to offer "a word to the wise" from my experience.

Last Friday as I drove down Gates Mills Boulevard, much to my surprise, I lost consciousness and drove up over the curb and onto the grass median. I regained consciousness as the car bumped and then came to a stop. "What happened?!?" I'm grateful to tell you that no one was injured in this incident but that question, "What happened?" was important and needed an answer. Thankfully, a Gates Mills police officer happened to be just on the other side of the Boulevard, and he immediately came to check on me. He gave me a ride to Hillcrest E.R. and the search for an answer to "What happened?" began.

Any of you who have spent time in an E.R. waiting room knows what comes next. People are seen in order of the severity of their injury or illness, and it often takes many hours to be seen. I called our Sr. Warden and Becky came right over to be with me, arriving with a chicken salad sandwich and a Ziplock bag of cherry tomatoes. After a couple of hours, the search for an answer began. Blood pressure and an EKG were taken, and blood was drawn. Eventually there was a chest x-ray, a CAT-scan of my head, and a continuous EKG and Blood pressure monitoring. Finally, I was admitted and rolled up to the 5th floor for continued observation (and more blood was drawn...)

The next day, as various test results rolled in, the results read "normal" "normal" "normal"

A doctor arrived at one point and looked closely at me while saying with a tone of some surprise, "You are a **very** healthy person!" One final test to go, which couldn't happen until Sunday morning: a sonogram of my heart. That, too, was normal. So, "What happened?" The official conclusion is that I was dehydrated! I have been busy over the past few weeks and, clearly, had not been drinking enough water. Friday afternoon my body simply reached a tipping point and sent me a message that I couldn't ignore.

As you may imagine, although I have been declared healthy, and am now making sure that I get my recommended eight, eight-ounce glasses of water a day; I feel anxious about getting behind the wheel of a car quite yet. Thanks to Chandler and Becky Everett, my car has been checked over by my mechanic and Nancy Novello will be my chauffeur to get my car back to Gates Mills. Randy and Debbie Cole are ferrying me to see my regular doctor for a follow-up appointment this week. And I will still be able to spend October in Maine thanks to our son, William, who will fly in from D.C. and take care of the driving for me.

Paul talked about the importance of "the Body" with its many parts, each supporting and helping the other parts; especially those who are weaker. This week I experienced receiving the love, care, and prayers of so many of you. He said that the members of the Body, though many, are One Body. You incarnated that for me this week. Thank you!

I know that with the passage of time, I will regain my confidence and will feel safe to drive once more. So, I look forward to seeing all of you in November as we turn toward the final weeks of the "Green Season" and prepare to greet Advent once more.

I promised you "a word to the wise" at the beginning of my story. **Drink water!** If you need to, make hash marks to keep track of how many glasses you have had. Apparently, once we pass the magic age of fifty years, our ability to notice that we are thirsty diminishes. So, pay extra attention to drinking plenty of water!

We will not be attending a Captain's game this year as there was not enough interest.

On behalf of the Jr. Warden, Becky presented two bids to replace the Rectory front steps. (We were not able to get a third bid.) After some discussion, the Vestry unanimously voted to accept the bid submitted by Skybridge. Work to be done while the Rector is on vacation in Maine this October.

Next Vestry meeting is August 30th at 6:30 p.m. The meeting closed with a prayer at 7:10 p.m.


