


# ST. CHRISTOPHER BY-THE-RIVER

## August 30, 2023

Meeting opened with a prayer at 6:30pm.

Approval of July 26th Vestry Meeting Minutes: Becky moved to accept the minutes as written; Bruce seconded and all approved. No discussion.

July Financial Report: Budget is in good shape with an \$11,000 surplus.

Mary Murray will attend September Vestry meeting to answer questions about the balance sheet and funds.

#### Rector's Report:

Update regarding the Christian Education Director Search: position is still listed in the Diocesan Weekly. One applicant did not move to the next level. Position will be posted on Handshake, a job resource service colleges and universities provide for their students and alumni; programs with Early Childhood Education majors.

Dixon Morgan will provide Godly Play until the position is filled; he was trained at St. Paul's.

Mary Podwoski will greet and assist as two unrelated adults must be in room, per Safe Church.

Faith Formation Updates – Book discussion, "What We Need is Here, Practicing the Heart of Christian Spirituality" by L. Roger Owens, will be led by Reverend Kidder.

The Bishop will visit early in 2024. People baptized or confirmed in the Christian tradition may be received into the Episcopal Church.

The Vestry will vote for three delegates and alternates for Diocesan Convention at the September meeting. Would be helpful for someone who has attended previously to attend. A Vestry member will be one of the delegates to attend Nov.10 & 11 in Wooster.

Becky moved to ask Reverend Kidder to contact list of potential delegates. Matt seconded. All approved.

#### SeniorWarden:

Stewardship Update: Becky and Chandler Everett will chair the 2024 Giving Campaign, "Dawn of a New Day."

Will officially announce at 10:15 service, the first Sunday in October. The official campaign will begin October 3rd and end November 15<sup>th</sup>. Goal is 80 pledges and \$185k. Two prizes, a \$100 gift card to Sara's Place and to a theater production at Playhouse Square, to all who pledged by deadline.
