Minutes of the 2022 Annual Meeting of The Parish of St. Christopher by-the-River
Held March 5, 2023

The Annual Meeting of St. Christopher by the River was called to order by Mother Ann at 11:18 AM. Mother Ann led the opening prayer.

Becky Everett was appointed clerk *pro-tem*. A quorum of communicants in good standing was confirmed. Rik Bole moved to accept the minutes from the 2021 Annual Meeting and was seconded. The motion passed.

Mother Ann summarized the state of the parish from the Annual Report. She thanked the staff for their dedication and hard work, and she thanked the off going Vestry members, Judy Holmes, Mary Holmes and Charley Marston, as well as the off going NEMAC representative, Laura Cotton.

Mary Murray provided a quick financial review of the past year which was very positive.

Both Judy Holmes and Laura Cotton have said they will continue on in their respective roles.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the Nominating Committees slate of officers:

Judy Holmes, Barb Pesuit and Matt Vazzana for 3 year terms on Vestry

Charlene Currutt for a one year term on Vestry, completing Sandy Redmond's unfinished term.

Laura Cotton for a two year term as the parish's representative on NEMAC.

The Motion passed.

New Vestry Members will attend a brief vestry meeting in the parish office immediately following the Annual Meeting. There was a motion to adjourn the Annual Meeting at 11:35 AM. A dismissal by Deacon Lydia Bailey followed.



RECTOR'S REPORT

2023 may have been the busiest, and most emotionally full, year that I have experienced in my time as your Rector. Attendance was noticeably up, thanks to our ability to finally have a year of worship and activities uninterrupted by the Covid pandemic. Total Sunday worship attendance for 2023 was 3,301 in-person. Thanks to John Irwin providing us with both live-streaming and recorded services, there were at least an additional 1,622 worshipers who joined us online. (We are only able to count online “views” as we have no way to determine how many individuals each “view” includes.) It was a banner year! This was driven home for me when 80 people came to the 8:30 Christmas Eve service. The last time that we had anywhere near that attendance was in 2018, two years before the pandemic. While attendance numbers might be boring for you to read, they are important as an indication of the overall health and vitality of our parish. After two years of pandemic shutdowns, and a slow reentry to “normalcy” in 2022, I can confidently say we are back! Our theme for the 2024 annual giving campaign, “The Dawn of a New Day” is very apt.

Ever since Easter Sunday, 2022, the parish has experienced an influx folks who have come to call St. Christopher’s “home”. About half of our new friends simply joined us for worship on a Sunday morning – and then kept coming back. Among those new friends is the Richards family. Larry, Gayle, Tommy, William, and James officially transferred their membership to St. Christopher’s in 2023. To all our new friends, please know that whether you are an official “member” or not, we are so glad you are here!

The other source of growth in our parish has resulted from the many weddings that take place at St. Christopher’s. In 2023 we recorded the marriages of Ben and Jenna Vandertill, Mark and Michele Hatfield, and Andrew and Elizabeth Short who were all either new to St. Christopher’s or had a historical connection to the parish. Weddings are always a joyful event but are particularly so when we already know the couple. In 2023 I had the joy of officiating at the weddings of Clay McMullen and Michelle Benz, Brandon Gray and Jenny Fullum, and Katie Everett and Jacob Halperin-Loche.

Sadly, in 2023 we experienced the deaths of too many long-time, deeply loved, parishioners.

Ron Misco, Bill McCoy, Joanne Reynolds, Ted Ramsey, Bruce Thomas, Lydia Zimmerman, Marcia Alpers, Rindy Collister, and Thom and Iris Vail all died in 2023. They left behind gaping holes in our hearts and memories that we continue to cherish. I also buried Charlotte Iafeliece, Elaine Pace, Judith Higbee, Donald Stonefeld, Michael Authon, and Beatrice Steif. Some had a historical relationship to St. Christopher’s, and some simply needed a Christian burial but all of them were beloved children of God. I am particularly grateful for having been able to offer the Last Rites of the Church to Suzanne Irwin Emerson, Bill McCoy, Ted Ramsey, Marcia Alpers, and Mimi Nook.

I was able to bless the home of Haley Kosmatka, Allison Smith, and Madeleine in February. In December, I blessed Barbara Blossom’s new home. House blessings are lovely – and a nice excuse for a party. Let me know if you would like me to bless your home. Additional blessings in 2023 were: the Historical Society’s groundbreaking, the Hunt Club’s beagle pack, your beloved animals, and a memorial bench for Ron Misco.

The reality of parish life is that it holds the fullness of what it means to be human, both the joys and the sorrows. Despite so many deaths among us, 2023 held many joyful moments as well. We welcomed another generation of the LaMantia family in March when we baptized four of Jim and Pam’s grandchildren; James John LaMantia, Abigail Nina McNelly, Christopher Andrew McNelly, Jr., and Nora Frances Sherwin. May saw the baptisms of Riley Elizabeth Brenner whose family is new to St. Christopher’s, and Olivia Koldenhoven, John Irwin’s grandniece. Olivia Kaya Mlakar was baptized in August and, adding to the excitement of Rally Sunday, Christopher Logan Miller was baptized on September 10th. (Logan is looking forward to being confirmed by Bishop Jolly when she visits us on May 5th.)

Our long-time Sunday Porter, Jolyon Welsh, also resigned in 2023. Thankfully, Lucy and Luis Calvo were able and willing to add those Sunday Porter duties to what they were already doing on Sunday mornings at St. Christopher’s. Lucy and Luis, thank you for your genuine love and care for our parish.

An important part of our faith lives is nurturing our knowledge and love of God and practicing bringing that relationship with the Holy One into our human daily lives and relationships. This is an all ages and whole life process. For many years, Peggy Reda led our Church School program with great success, and we were blessed to have her daughter, Melanie Reda, in charge of Nursery Care for those too young to participate in a formal class. In recent years, our older Church School participants have “aged out” into a variety of school, family, and sport team activities that often take place on Sunday mornings. Our current children are primarily under four years of age. Peggy, accurately I think, saw this moment in our parish life as a closing of one chapter and the opening of another. She decided that it was time to retire. Melanie had taken on the leadership of our Bargain Box sale program and was feeling stretched for time and energy, so she joined her mother in offering her resignation. I reluctantly accepted their decisions and we celebrated and gave thanks for their many years of service at a festive Coffee Hour.

I firmly believe that God provides for the needs of God’s church and so, Dixon Morgan and Mary Podowski have stepped forward to provide our children with the opportunity to learn about God’s love for them through the Godly Play approach to Christian faith formation. Since the children are still a bit too young for even that amount of structure, Andrea Calvo is currently providing Sunday Nursery Care for our youngest members. We are so grateful. Thank you!

Our adult formation occurs primarily on Sunday mornings at 9:00 and on Thursday afternoons at 4:00. Our focus since Covid has been on the development of our inner life and the inevitable transformation we experience through the Holy Spirit’s presence and action. In 2023 we read and discussed the following books: “Walk in Love: Episcopal Beliefs & Practices” by Scott Gunn and Melody Wilson Shobe, “The Gift of Years: Growing Older Gracefully” by Joan Chittester, “The Book of Joy” by Archbishop Desmond Tutu and His Holiness, the Dalai Lama, and “What We Need is Here” by J. Roger Owens. Additionally, between Easter and Pentecost, I led a three-part series on the Incarnation, Crucifixion, and Resurrection. I encourage you all to join us in our current series about Spiritual Gifts (Wednesdays during our Simple Suppers and Sundays at 9:00)

Finally, I want to acknowledge and thank our Staff, who make so much of what we do as a parish possible. Deacon Lydia Bailey, Music Director and Organist, Yuri McElliott, Parish Administrator, Mary Zup, Church Keeper Lucy Calvo, Sexton Luis Calvo, Nursery Director Andrea Calvo, Office Volunteer Becky Everett and Livestream Maestro John Irwin all give generously of their time and love for this parish. Thank you all so much! Our Wardens, Becky Everett and Charlene Currutt, Treasurer Mary Murray, Clerk Renee Kolecki, and Vestry Members Ron Lee, Peter Thatcher, Judy Holmes, Bruce Long, Matt Vazzana, and Rich Radis have been wonderful partners with me in the leadership that is so important for the parish’s effectiveness for ministry. I am grateful to serve alongside all of you.

Please join me in thanking our Sr. Warden Becky Everett for her leadership over two full Vestry terms, a total of six years! Our bylaws require her to step away from Vestry service for at least one year. She has been a magnificent Vestry Member, Jr. Warden, and Sr. Warden over those six years. Thank you, Becky, for your wisdom, guidance, trust in God, and good humor. I will miss working with you, but you deserve a break! Enjoy all your new free time with family and friends – but don’t be a stranger! I look forward to seeing you around the Office, hearing you in the Choir, and seeing you at the Altar. May God bless you for all that you have given in service to our parish.

All of you have a part in the life and ministry of this parish and we would not be St. Christopher’s without you. Thank you to all of you: Women’s Guild, Altar Guild, Coffee Hour Hosts, Eucharistic Ministers, Eucharistic Visitors, Lectors, Shelter Lunch Bakers and Servers, Choir, Hand Chime Choir, Ushers and Greeters, Godly Play Leaders, Bargain Box Worker Bees. We need and appreciate each and all of you. Thank you for loving God, loving your neighbor, and changing the world!

2023 has been quite a busy year. We began with a Vestry Retreat where the Vestry identified the strengths of St. Christopher's – leadership, service and outreach being at the top. The Vestry wanted to concentrate on children's faith formation as well as building the next generation of the parish. The importance of improving fellowship events was also emphasized.

The 2024 Day by Day calendars to benefit the Men's Shelter were printed and sales began in the summer. They continued through the rest of the year. To date, St. Christopher's has donated close to \$2000 to the Men's Shelter to purchase daily RTA bus passes! Thank you to all who gave favorite quotes to fill the calendar as well as everyone who purchased these calendars! Gratitude also goes out to all who were involved with the Holiday Dinner at LMM in December. Between the making of casseroles, the baking of cookies and serving the meal at the shelter, there were many volunteers who gave their time and talents to this special ministry.

With emphasis being placed on children's faith formation, Godly Play materials were purchased and a classroom on the second floor is now dedicated to this program. Godly Play allows children to explore the mystery of God's presence in their lives by listening to Bible stories, wondering and playing with the materials.

With Peggy and Melanie Reda retiring from their many wonderful years of service with our children, St. Christopher's began searching for a new Christian Education Director. We spoke with many of the young families to find out what they wanted for their children when it came to faith development. We have not found an individual to fill this position yet, but two wonderful parishioners volunteered to be trained in the Godly Play curriculum and spent some time in the nursery with a few of our youngest parishioners last Fall. With the crazy demands of life that our families have to face, we have not gotten the regular attendance at Sunday School that we had anticipated, but we are dedicated to finding out how we can best support our young families.



We had a number of Fellowship events this year! The Pentecost Picnic last Spring at Marston Park was a huge success as was Rally Sunday this past September! The recent Twelfth Night Party held in our Fellowship Hall at St. Christopher's this past January was lovely, and many people attended and enjoyed delicious food and meaningful fellowship! The Pancake Breakfast is as popular as ever, and, finally, Lenten Simple Suppers are back during Lent after having been absent for a few years due to Covid. These are always enjoyable evenings with various themes for discussion during dinner.



It has been a very rewarding year working with our outstanding Junior Warden, Charlene Currutt. She led us through a very busy year of capitol projects and various repairs and improvements. Her dedication is unmatched and her love for this church and this community is very evident! It has been my honor to work with her this past year, and I have no doubt of her continued dedication to this parish.

Lastly, I would like to say what a joy it has been to know and work with Mother Ann over the past 6 years on Vestry. 

In accordance with the spending policy for the year 2023, the Fund *distributed a total of \$138,921.64* to St. Christopher by-the-River's operating funds. Distributions are made on a quarterly basis.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Support from the congregation has increased for the third year in a row after the pandemic-related trough of 2020. Although we had forecast a small deficit for the year, we received two significant, unbudgeted gifts in late December that provided a surplus of over \$37 thousand. In addition, pledge activity was very strong this past Fall, and we are confident that this will help us manage an expected increased expense load in 2024. Support from the St. Christopher Fund has been consistent.

On the expense side, we provided raises for all staff although these took place slightly later than budgeted, and our utilities expenses were not as high as we had conservatively estimated. These 'savings' were offset by other expenses that primarily reflected higher usage of the church, and actual expenses came in very close to budget.

Our balance sheet remains strong and liquid.

OUTREACH AT LUTHERAN METROPOLITAN MINISTRY

I am so grateful for this parish, how you have been an ongoing presence at Lutheran Metropolitan Ministry Men's Shelter since 2017. A big step forward was when the Women's Guild began serving lunch in 2018 and others came on board for an art workshop, poetry, and the listening program. Beginning in 2022 St. Christopher's has teamed with St. Paul's Episcopal to serve lunch on the 2nd Wednesday of every month. Every other month our parishes join in providing the food as well. Beginning in 2023 both parishes have also hosted a large evening meal in December, no small feat for up to 350 shelter residents.

In 2023 parishioners created a Day-by-Day calendar for 2024, your daily quotes combining with quotes from shelter residents. This creative effort raised \$1,971 from calendar sales with all proceeds going to the shelter for bus passes for shelter residents.

Bargain Box in 2023 continued to be an extraordinarily successful parish effort, with a \$2,000 check given to the Housing & Shelter branch of LMM, for the renovation of more affordable homes for families transitioning out of homelessness.

\$701.00 (to be exact!) was donated by Addie's Cup in Gates Mills to St. Christopher's, the proceeds of last September's tips. This parish generously passed this on directly to the shelter for purchase of winter boots for shelter residents.

Thank you to everyone. What you have done here at the shelter is a powerful image for the vocation of Christian service, living into our identity as a parish that serves.
