

ST. CHRISTOPHER BY-THE-RIVER NOVEMBER 2024 NEWSLETTER

On the evening of October 23, 2024, the Vestry met and dealt with a large number of issues, including ongoing repairs and improvements to the Rectory and further advances in the search process for a new Rector.

Contracts have been let for a number of updates and improvements to the Rectory including repairs to the roof, to the chimneys, painting the interior of the Rectory and a number of other projects. All of these projects are being managed by our Junior Warden, Charlene Currutt who is doing a fantastic job in the face of a huge workload.

The Vestry approved the contract with the diocesan recommended Search Consultants Anne Schmidt and her colleague Nora Smith. Their fees are quite modest and they have a major role to play in guiding the Search Committee, and accordingly the parish, in the process of identifying, evaluating and ultimately guiding the Vestry toward the proper candidate to serve as our next Rector.

The Search Committee has been finalized and will be commissioned shortly. The Search Consultants will contact the Search Committee and begin the process of fulfilling all of the necessary steps in this transition. We anticipate that this process will take several months, but I remain very optimistic that the results will be excellent.

We plan to have a photo display in the narthex in the near future with pictures of each member of the search committee so that all the parish will know who is undertaking this work and feel comfortable communicating with the Search Committee about each person's desires, wishes, and prayers about a new Rector. Two members of the Search Committee are members of the Vestry, but it is the Search Committee itself which does the work of identifying a candidate. The role of the Vestry is to support, financially and otherwise, the work of the Search Committee, but not to perform the search itself. Accordingly, please direct your comments, input, questions, concerns, and of course your prayers, to the members of the Search Committee. They will be calling upon all the parishioners as this process moves forward in order to generate a broad and representative picture of what we feel will be best for this church in the years to come.

Dr. Irwin declared a forum was present and opened the meeting with a prayer at 7 PM. Dr. Irwin served as Acting Clerk.

Previous Minutes

The draft minutes of the Vestry meeting on August 28, 2024, were then reviewed. Upon motion, the minutes were approved as drafted.

Financial Statements

The July 2024 financial statements not yet ready for distribution and accordingly, a review of same was deferred until the next Vestry meeting.

Junior Warden Report

The Junior Warden then reported on the status of several projects, including multiple issues that need to be addressed in the Rectory. Ms. Currutt is obtaining quotes, estimates and recommendations from a variety of contractors relating to the roof, the chimneys, and the trees behind the Rectory garage running along Mrs. Rankin's property line.

Ms. Currutt also reported on the need to have an assessment made of the water issue on the bridge easement side of the Church. Most concerning is evidence of water coming through the wall on which the electrical panels are mounted. An insurance adjuster for the Episcopal Church insurance company has inspected the area, and there are several possible solutions, beginning with an inspection of the gutter drainage pipes serving that area, as well as the consideration of a French drain to facilitate heavy runoff. Ms. Currutt will report on these issues further as additional estimates and information becomes available.

Senior Warden Report

The Senior Warden then reported on the formation of the Search Committee. He submitted a proposal containing information to the Vestry regarding the formation of the Search. A copy of the proposal is attached to these minutes as an exhibit.

A lengthy discussion ensued during which many names of parishioners were offered and discussed for consideration on the Search Committee. The Senior Warden then called for a resolution to begin the formation of that Committee and to appoint David Dickenson and Kitty Thomas as co-chairs, as well as Richard Radis as an additional Vestry representative on the Search Committee Formation Group. On motion duly made and seconded, the motion was passed.

That Group would be assigned

the undertaking of selecting additional parish members to constitute a Search Committee of seven or nine members. In accordance with Diocesan guidelines, those names will then be presented to the Senior Warden for approval.

On motion duly made and seconded, the motion was passed.

There being no further business to come before the Vestry this evening, Dr. Irwin offered a closing prayer, and on motion duly made and seconded, the meeting was adjourned at 8:50 PM.

The next meeting of the Vestry is scheduled for Wednesday, September 23, 2024, at 7 PM in the Guild Room.



Our Rectory is officially open for a facelift!


- 1. The chimneys and roof of the rectory are now set and ready to go! Tuckpointing on all three chimneys, plus new stack collars, caps and the surrounding roof/shingles were repaired. (\$2400)
- 2. The floors will be finished this coming November. (\$7,000)
- 3. The vestry has recently approved a company to paint a much-needed interior of the rectory. (\$24,000). Three quotes were received and reviewed. Painting will commence in January.
- 4. New Man Doors have been purchased for the rectory garage. Luis will replace them soon before the critters start searching for a warm home!
- 5. Most of the left-over Rectory furniture was Sold at Bargain Box. There are a few pieces left, available for free to anyone who can pick them up. (See pictures below)
