As we come to the beginning of a new Church Year and draw near to the end of our calendar year, we remain steadfast and active in our worship of God, our services and ministries to the community, and our love of one another at St. Christopher by the River.

We face the challenge of searching for our next Rector, but all of that is going well. We have formed and commissioned a broadly representative Search Committee composed of longtime members, new members, men, and women, reflecting the breadth and depth of our congregation. I am confident that our search Committee, under the guidance of our Search Consultants and our Bishop and the Canon to the Ordinary will result in our obtaining another devout, skillful, gracious and inspirational Rector. Please take every opportunity to speak with members of the Search Committee, whose names and photos are posted on the bulletin board and in our various publications, to express your wishes, hopes, desires, preferences, and needs about a new Rector.

Meanwhile our financial circumstances remain good. Our annual giving campaign has proceeded well, although I hope that in the last weeks of this year additional pledges will come in, allowing us to achieve 100% of our goal.

We have made much progress in the last several months in beginning the restoration of the Rectory. Our Junior Warden has been unbelievably busy dealing with contractors of all types and specialties to give this 174-year-old building the love and attention that it needs. We want to make that residence an attractive, comfortable and updated living space for our next Rector.

Our multiple ministries, including the Women's Guild, Bargain Box, Daughters of the King, our participation in the Lutheran Men's Shelter, and our Eucharistic Visitors have all continued unabated.

We have also been very blessed to have Supply Clergy, including especially Richard Israel and Rose Ann Lonsway, to serve as our clerical and liturgical leaders and pastoral caregivers during this time of transition. We owe much to them and look forward to their continued participation with us through the remainder of our Transition.

Lastly, we should all give great thanks to the members of our staff upon whose shoulders additional burdens have fallen during the absence of a Rector. All of our staff, Yuri McElliott, Mary Zup, Lucy, Luis and Andria Calvo, Becky Everett, our unpaid office volunteer who spends much of her life working in our office with Mary Zup, our Treasurer, Marry Murray, who labors endlessly in the deep background, keeping our finances in order, and our Junior Warden, Charlene Currutt, who has assumed essentially a full time job, caring for two very old, very beautiful, and very historic buildings. Please express your gratitude to all of them. The amount and quality of the work they do for us is truly remarkable. We could not survive without these wonderful people.

We look forward to the coming birth of our Lord through the celebration of this Advent season, as well as the coming new year with hope, faith and dedication.

SEPTEMBER 25, 2024

Present: Ms. Charlene Currutt, Dr. John Irwin, Ms. Judy Holmes, Dr. Bruce Long, Mr. Ron Lee, Mr. Richard Radis, and Ms. Kitty Thomas.

Dr. Irwin declared a forum was present and opened the meeting with a prayer at 7 PM. Dr. Irwin served as Acting Clerk.

Previous Minutes

The draft minutes of the Vestry meeting on August 28, 2024, were then reviewed. Upon motion, the minutes were approved as drafted.

Financial Statements

The July 2024 financial statements are not yet ready for distribution, so a review of them was deferred until the next Vestry meeting.

Junior Warden Report

The Junior Warden then reported that we are awaiting a return visit from Bob McCue, the plumber, to assess the drainage issue on the east side of the church. The solution to the seepage of water into the church basement, especially around the electrical panels, may be related either to a blocked drain from the gutters or the need for additional drainage pipes.

Ms. Currutt then reported on a number of projects ongoing in the rectory, including the recent removal of trees and stumps behind it. She received a contract for repairing the rectory roof and chimneys. These will cost less than \$2500 and do not require vestry approval.

The largest item at present relates to repairing the wood floors on the first level of the rectory. These need to be sanded, stained, and covered with polyurethane, and these estimates are all in the neighborhood of \$6000-\$10,000. The recommended contract was with Hardwood Floors by Jackson at a total cost of \$7200.80, and on motion duly made and seconded, that contract was approved.

The remaining major expense for the moment will be painting the interior of the rectory. We are waiting for the final estimates from three painters. These estimates will probably be around \$25,000.

Senior Warden Report

The Senior Warden reported that Vestry Member Matt Vazanna has indicated his desire to resign from the Vestry because of work and family commitments. On motion duly made and seconded, his resignation was, regretfully, accepted with our very best wishes to him and his family and with the hope that he and his family will continue to worship with us and continue to be part of our parish family.

The Senior Warden discussed the application of the Code of Regulations, Article III, which sets forth the procedures for filling a vacancy in the Vestry by a Qualified Elector. The Senior Warden will identify an individual to fill this vacancy and present that person's name to the Vestry at its next meeting for approval.

The Search Committee Formation Group has returned with recommendations for appointing nine individuals to serve on the Search Committee. The proposed membership includes the following:

Three parishioners, John Irwin, Kitty Thomas, and Larry Richmond, have been selected to serve as certified voting lay delegates to the diocesan convention on November 8 and 9, 2024. On motion duly made and seconded, those appointments were approved.

A general discussion then evolved regarding the church's security arrangements, including replacing key cylinders in the church doors and changing the pattern of nighttime lighting around the church. Dr. Bruce Long will continue to research possible technological additions to the church, such as video cameras.

There being no further business to come before the Vestry this evening, Dr. Irwin offered a closing prayer, and on motion duly made and seconded, the meeting was adjourned at 8:50 PM.

The next meeting of the Vestry is scheduled for Wednesday, October 23, 2024, at 7 PM in the Guild Room.

RECTOR SEARCH COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Rector Search Committee is now fully commissioned to begin their work in finding the best possible Rector for St. Christopher's. With the holidays in full swing now I ask your patience for time. We will begin seriously after Jan. 1st. Our consultants have encouraged us we need full attention and concentration to this search. They understand that to delay one month is a good idea so we can more fully focus. I ask your patience.
