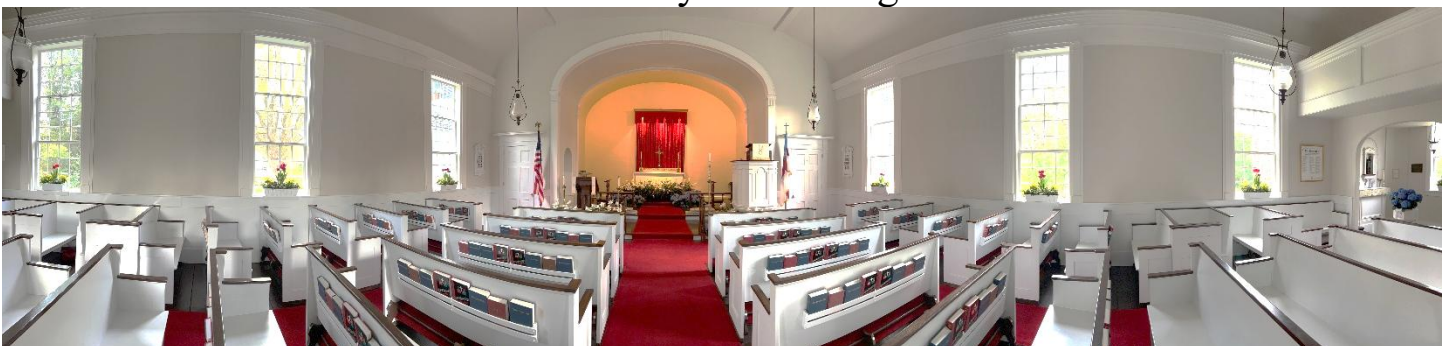

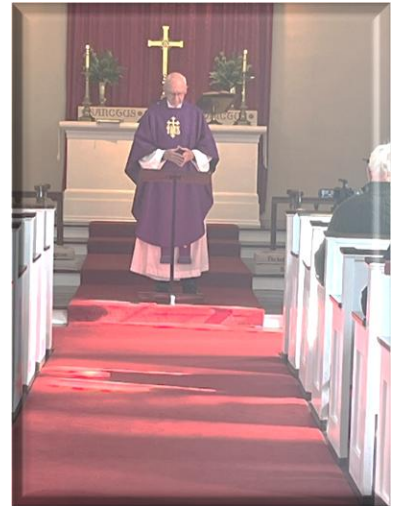

## RECTOR'S REPORT

Dear St. Christopher's,

I am thrilled to submit this report as your new priest-in-charge. A month into my ministry here, my offering will be shorter than reports for future years, but know that my heart is so, so full. I am grateful, too, for how full this first month has been. In my first twenty-eight days with you, we have had strong engagement in worship, a joyful baptism, a delicious pancake breakfast, and a prayerful start to Lent on Ash Wednesday. I have shared coffee or a meal with many of you, and I have made a few calls on parishioners who are home-bound. St. Christopher's might be a small village parish, but there is a lot of joy and energy here. I am thrilled to join in on that joy and energy with you!



I have to express deep gratitude to everyone who led the parish during the time of transition before my arrival. I am grateful to Bishop Jolly, Canon Jessie Dodson, John, our Senior Warden (canonical authority during the absence of a rector), Charlene, our Junior Warden, the Vestry, the Search Committee (chaired by Kitty Thomas), supply clergy (especially Rev. You stayed closely-knit as the work of the Church continued, and that deep commitment to community has made my job of onboarding so easy and smooth. Supporting this commitment to community and growing the healthy community that already exists will be central to my ministry with you. I truly believe we have much to offer the beautiful village that surrounds us, and we begin his work on strong-footing.

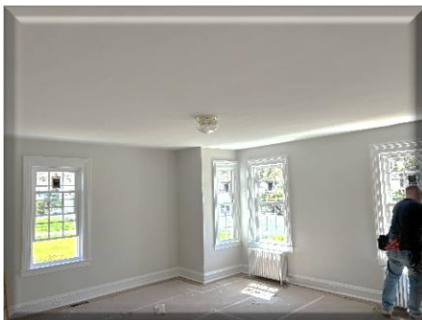

**Church Improvements**

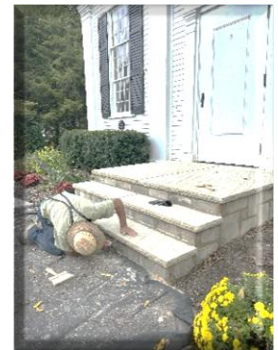

**SENIOR WARDEN'S REPORT**

Dear Parishioners,

Over the past nearly 20 years, I have had the honor of being elected to the Vestry several times. During those terms, I have had the further honor to be elected to serve as Senior Warden. I held these positions during the tenure of both Conrad Selnick and Ann Kidder. I worked closely and productively with both Rectors, meeting with them regularly and sharing in the responsibilities of leading this Parish. Notwithstanding all of that experience, it truly was not until I began serving as Senior Warden during our recent time of transition that I learned firsthand the seemingly endless amount of nearly full-time work that is involved in serving this Parish as a replacement for almost all the duties of a Rector or a Priest in charge, with the exception of liturgical and pastoral care. You don't really know what a person does until you have to replace them yourself.

This has been a truly eye-opening experience and has given me a deeper understanding and greater respect than ever before for the duties of a priest. I am pleased to hand over all of those responsibilities to our new priest-in-charge, Father Gabriel Lawrence. I am certain he will meet and exceed all of our expectations. Perhaps no one welcomes him to this Parish more than I.

With that said, I also feel a deep sense of appreciation and gratitude for everyone in this Parish who contributed so much of themselves, their time, devotion, and money to keep St. Christopher by the River running at full speed for the last 18 months. I begin, of course, by thanking all members of the Vestry over the past months for their continued diligent service to the Parish, guiding it well and ensuring we could continue all of our internal and outreach ministries throughout this time.

In particular, I thank our Junior Warden, Charlene Currutt, who labored so much and achieved so much during this time, particularly the fantastic restoration of the Rectory. Her ability to identify the appropriate vendors, tradesmen, artisans, and others, and to negotiate the most favorable terms, was truly astounding. We owe her greatly.

In addition, all members of our staff, Mary Zup, Luis, Lucy, and Andrea Calvo, and our new in-house bookkeeper, Patti Paczos, have kept our historic, beautiful buildings in fine shape and our finances in good order. Parishioner Richard Hamilton has assumed the role of Treasurer, working closely with the Vestry and our office staff to manage our finances.

We may all remember that our Bishop and the Canon to the Ordinary expressed confidence in this Parish, describing it as stable, and I believe the Parish demonstrated that stability throughout the long transition. The Women's Guild, Bargain Box, the Altar Guild, and all of our various outreach programs continued unabated during the transition. The Annual Giving Campaign, under the guidance of Becky Everett, again met its goal. Our primary supply clergy, Father Richard Israel, supplemented on occasion by Mother Rose Ann Lonsway and Father Dan Schoonmaker, worked closely with our office staff and our music director, Yuri McElliott, to continue our liturgical services. At the same time, Father Israel managed the pastoral needs of our Parish.

In the midst of all this, Kitty Thomas and the members of the Search Committee completed their labors, including producing the Parish Profile. They coordinated with Canon Jessie Dodson and our Bishop to lead us to our Priest-in-Charge, Father Gabriel. Meanwhile, Vestry member Haley Kosmatka chaired the Nominating Committee and produced the slate of nominees for this annual meeting.

All of this demonstrates that the Parish has remained, across all dimensions, as active as before the transition. I think that is a remarkable testament to the stability of St. Christopher by the River and to our collective devotion to this church. Please express your thanks and gratitude to these people and, in fact, to all of us, each and every one, for keeping our church healthy and prosperous.

It is truly an honor to be part of this Community of God.

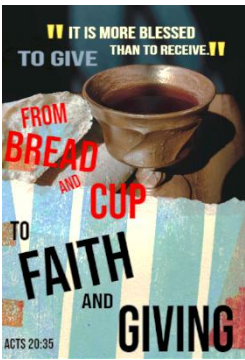
- July, 2025 St. Christopher's Church Profile was updated by the Search Committee. Print Design was by Wendy J. Donkin, Small Seeds Designs. Printing done by Morgan Litho, 4101 Common Ave, Cleveland, Ohio 44103. The Profile booklet including print and colorful pictures was 20 pages, and 100 copies were made.
- Oct. 9, 2025 Father Gabriel Michael Lawrence after being impressed viewing the Profile wrote to Canon Jesse Dodson discerning a call to contact St. Christopher's to learn more about the parish, members and activities.
- Oct. 16, 2025 Jesse Dodson met with the Search Committee to tell them more about Father Gabriel and why she as well as Bishop Jolly thought he was an ideal candidate for St. Christopher's next Priest-in-Charge. She explained his background, interests and strengths
- Nov. 3, 2025 Jesse Dodson forwarded lots of information about Father Gabriel for the Search Committee to review. Included were his education, experience, certification, skills, diocesan service and community involvement. The Oct. 9<sup>th</sup> letter from Father Gabriel to Jesse showing strong interest was included. Also listed were Father Gabriel's videos of sermons and informal talks. References were also of interest to the Search Committee.
- Nov. 5, 2025 Father Gabriel met for one hour at Jesse's request for a first interview with the Search Committee
- Nov. 14, 2025 The Search Committee met with the Vestry for lunch and introduced Father Gabriel to them. The Vestry asked him lots of questions. It was a very meaningful lunch. He was engaging, relaxed and answered all questions appropriately
- Nov. 23, 2025 Each member of the Search Committee wrote a paragraph explaining why each thought Father Gabriel would be a good Priest-in-Charge for St. Christopher by the River. These statements were compiled into a report given to each Vestry member to read and digest. Then a vote was made by the Vestry to approve or disapprove of Father Gabriel as our next Priest-in-Charge. It was unanimous in favor of Father Gabriel to become our next Priest-in-Charge.
- Dec. 5, 2025 The Search Committee's job ended. John Irwin, Senior Warden received a blessing from Bishop Jolly. He then offered Father Gabriel the position of Priest-in-Charge for a 3-year term. A "Letter of Agreement" was signed by The Senior Warden and Father Gabriel
- Jan. 9, 2026 Father Gabriel moves into the St. Christopher's Rectory
- Feb 1, 2026 Father Gabriel conducts his first service at St. Christopher by the River

## ST. CHRISTOPHER'S FUND REPORT

In accordance with the spending policy for the year 2025, the Fund ***distributed a total of \$132,722*** to St. Christopher by-the-River's operating funds. Distributions are made on a quarterly basis.

Total gifts to the fund in 2025 were \$10,000. We wish to recognize and thank our donors for their generous support. Their kindness will have a major impact on the financial security of St. Christopher by-the-River.

**TREASURER'S REPORT**  
**Respectfully Submitted by Richard A. Hamilton**

Support from the community remains strong with total congregational support exceeding both 2024 levels and the 2025 budget <sup>(1)</sup>. Plate and special gift giving were consistent year over year and in line with budget expectations. Congregational support remains at nearly 60% of total receipts, a healthy percentage for a parish of our size. Support from the St. Christopher Fund was 5.0% of the Fund's assets in 2025 and is expected to remain at this level due to strong market performance and the desire to grow the endowment.

Overall, expenses in 2025 were lower than budgeted and lower than prior year primarily because of Mother Ann's retirement as of August 1, 2024, which affected the Rectory operating costs as well as salaries and benefits in 2025. Lower than expected reliance upon contractors also led to a favorable personnel expense budget variance. Finally, the Diocesan assessment was lower than budget and prior year due to the lower overall operating expenses. For the year, we posted a strong surplus. Our balance sheet remains strong and liquid.

For fiscal year 2026, total expenses are projected to be approximately \$25K higher than 2025 driven primarily by higher personnel, property, and assessment expenses.

1) \$30K of the \$185K in 2026 pledge commitments were received in 2025 and will be reflected in the 2026 financial statements.

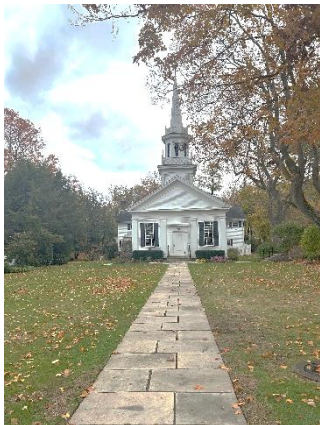
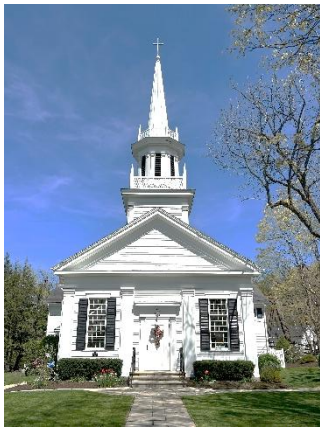
